STARTING BIDS

Estimates are in Australian dollars

The starting bid is 80% of the estimate unless pre-auction bids require otherwise

BUYER'S PREMIUM

The premium payable by successful bidders is 15% of the hammer price

plus another 5% if the bid was submitted via the online platform provided by Auction Mobility

VENDOR'S COMMISSION

The commission payable by vendors is 10% of the hammer price

COLLECTION OF LOTS

From our office at 20 Egerton Street Silverwater until 8 pm on the day of the auction

and afterwards from 10 am to 3 pm on Tuesdays and Saturdays

RESULTS

ABOUT THIS AUCTION

This auction has been long in gestation. The draft catalogue was commenced 37 months ago. The patience of our vendors, some of whom provided consignments up to four years ago, is much appreciated. The content of the auction provides something for everybody, from the specialist to the general collector, and caters for most philatelic interests. Similarly to Auctions #141 and #142, this auction is offered 'live' on line, this time through a firm named 'Auction Mobility'. Bids for Lots 1 to 1000 may be made from your home as the auction proceeds.

The catalogue is divided into two sections. Better grade items offered in the room and online are listed in Part 1. Generally less expensive items that are offered via absentee bidding only are listed in Part 2. Both parts of the catalogue have been printed and mailed to those on our mailing list, and they also are posted to our website.

Accompanying the print catalogue is a separate booklet containing images of lots 1 to 1000 from Part 1 offered in the room and online. The complete folder of images is posted to our website.

With 2,299 lots and estimates totalling more than \$522,000, this is our most ambitious auction.

The lots offered include:

an extensive assembly of the Australia Kangaroo and Map issue and KGV definitives with many inverted and sideways watermarks, colour shade variations, punctured and overprinted 'OS' issues and listed plate flaws;

outstanding selections of booklets, postage dues and rare decimal varieties;

1914 6d engraved Kookaburra plate number blocks;

1928 3d Kookaburra miniature pane in complete sheets with Exhibition cancellations in green, red/green and red; and a first day cover cancelled in red;

the very rare 1931 3d blue Kingsford Smith Flights overprinted 'OS' with 'plane dropping mailbag';

30-plus copies of the ubiquitous 5/- Harbour Bridge (our Auction Manager reckons all 72,500 have survived) in varying degrees of condition within a price range that is affordable to every collector;

1940s-1960s positional pieces with listed plate errors;

comprehensive collections of the numbered and datestamp cancellations of New South Wales;

an extensive offering from Britain including many rarities;

the remaining 47 lots from the Ron Flowers bequest from Auction #141 comprising British Commonwealth;

1902-1930s covers from Ascension franked with British and local adhesives;

1950s-1970s China with many rarities;

1830-1890s covers from the Colony of Canada;

early postal history from Denmark including a letter written by King Christian VII in 1792;

a fine collection of Malta;

a varied assembly of less expensive items from all over the world, local issues, thematics and cinderellas; and our usual boxed/bulk material for the dedicated fossicker.

A WORD (OR THREE) ABOUT PHILAS

The Philatelic Association of N.S.W. Limited (PHILAS) is an ‘umbrella’ organisation, to which the 42 stamp collector clubs in the state are affiliated. The clubs have the benefit of affordable public liability cover under a PHILAS insurance policy.

PHILAS hosts a large philatelic reference / research library, which is available to both the members of the clubs and members of the public. To house the library, it owns a building. That building also provides rooms for city-based clubs to hold meetings and displays, for meetings of organising committees of exhibitions and philatelic events, and is the venue for ‘Open’ Days to which members of the public are invited and at which dealers and clubs provide displays and sales points.

To help meet the costs of ownership and maintenance of the building, PHILAS conducts auctions of philatelic and related material. The revenue derived from the buyer premium and vendor commission is used literally to keep the lights on.

The auctions provide a medium through which club members are able to sell surplus material and acquire items. The bulk/boxed material in particular is well patronised. To many club members, the auctions are the sole activity undertaken by PHILAS.

Auction-related tasks and many other tasks associated with the governance of the organisation and maintenance of the building are entrusted entirely to volunteer staff, who are drawn from the clubs. The organisation has no paid secretariat. Our volunteer staff are free to put in as much or as little time as they choose and to turn up whenever they choose to do so.

My point is that PHILAS is not a separate club with its own discrete membership. We regular staff members are **no more** PHILAS than other club members (yes that means you), and the club members (again that means you) are **no less** PHILAS than us.

On the previous page is an acknowledgement of the effort expended on this auction by the small number of volunteer staff identified there. Their individual contributions have varied, from a few hours occasionally, to four hours once each week, to six hours or more twice each week . This auction would not have been possible but for their collective effort.

Unfortunately, the total people hours contributed no longer are sufficient to enable PHILAS to continue these auctions in the format to which club members have become accustomed. In particular, we are unable to continue to process consignments of bulk/boxed material, which is a very time-consuming task. The sustainability of the entire auction project is in some jeopardy. At the last annual meeting, club delegates were briefed on the situation. Your delegate may or may not have relayed the message. If you patronise the auctions, as a buyer or seller, and/or you want them to continue, you might care to step up and assist.

What will you be asked to do? You could help to assess consignments, from single album collections to multiple boxes, to break the consignment into saleable lots and to write descriptions of those lots – exactly as you read in the catalogue – and to calculate estimates of the sum an item might bring. If you suspect that you do not have the knowledge to do that, I remind you that we all can read and interpret a reference catalogue. It’s not hard. For trickier or rarer items, we have subject matter experts on whom we can call. You might also scan images of better items selected from those lots, to provide photographs to illustrate the catalogue. If you can type, you might be asked to enter descriptions into the print and online catalogues. You might be asked to cross-reference the final lot numbers in the draft catalogue against the vendor codes that were allocated to each lot when you described them, to ensure nothing has been missed or listed in error. You could record absentee bids as they arrive. There are many other clerical tasks undertaken before we can mail catalogues or place the catalogue on the website. Before the auction, we need people to supervise viewing by prospective bidders. Without staff to do that, we cannot offer secure viewing windows. After the auction, you could assist to print and send invoices to winning bidders, and to package lots to be posted to them.

I hope this snapshot has been helpful. If you patronise the auctions, and/or you prefer them to continue, you may consider joining our band.

THE CONDITIONS OF SALE

PLACEMENT OF A BID

Placement of a bid constitutes acceptance of all the conditions set out below.

ESTIMATES / STARTING BIDS

The description of all lots is accompanied by our estimate of the likely price. This is merely an expression of the opinion of the auctioneer of the market value of the lot. Usually bidding opens at 80% of the estimate. Absentee bids lower than 80% of the estimate likely are to be declined.

VIEWING

You can view lots only at our office during the times set out in the catalogue and on our website.

SCANS OF LOTS

Scans of lots or parts of lots that are not provided in the printed or online catalogues may be emailed to you on request, if we have enough staff to accommodate your request.

THE AUCTIONEER IS THE SOLE ARBITER

All lots are sold to the highest bidder at one advance increment over the second highest bid, subject to any reserve. The Auctioneer has discretion to settle any dispute. All decisions of the Auctioneer are final.

HOW TO BID

You can bid by:

- attendance at the auction and bidding in person;
- 'live' by telephone through your agent during the auction by prior arrangement;
- 'live' online during the auction from your own device;
- completion of an absentee bid form returned to our office by the advertised due time/date;
- telephone prior to the start of the auction.

You may authorise our Auctions Manager to act as your agent.

If you are bidding otherwise than in the room, you are to provide us with a postal address, a telephone contact and an email address. Credit card particulars also may be required.

REFUSAL OF BIDS

The Auctioneer can refuse your bid. 'Buy' bids are not accepted.

'Either' or 'Or' bids may be accepted if they are within five lots of one another.

'Limit' bids can be made only in the room by your agent. You may authorise our Auctions Manager to act as your agent.

PHILAS accepts no responsibility for any errors or omissions.

BID INCREMENTS

Bids are accepted in Australian dollars in the following steps:

Absentee bids that are 'out of step' are to be rounded down to the nearest increment.

TITLE

If you purchase a lot:

- the risk passes to you at the fall of the hammer;
- title passes to you when you make full payment;
- if you bid in the auction room you are requested to pay for and collect your lot/s on the day of the auction; and
- if you bid by any other method, you are to pay the hammer price plus buyer's commission and postage and insurance within 14 days of your receipt of our invoice.

If you authorised an agent to bid on your behalf, the agent and you are liable jointly and severally for all fees and charges.

BUYER'S PREMIUM

A premium of 15% of the successful bid is to be added to all invoices.

An additional premium of 5% is added to all successful bids made on the Auction Mobility platform.

PAYMENT AND SHIPPING

Invoices are provided during the auction to room bidders.

Invoices including the postage cost are emailed or posted to absentee bidders as soon as possible after the auction.

Lots to be mailed are despatched as soon as possible after the auction.

The timing of provision of invoices and postage of lots depends entirely on the availability of volunteer staff.

We make every effort to pack your lots securely. However, we cannot accept any liability for packing deficiencies. We will post your lots by registered / tracked mail via Australia Post.

UNSOLD LOTS

All unsold lots are available for purchase for two weeks after the auction at 80% of the estimate

COLLECTION OF PURCHASES

Room bidders are expected to pay for and collect their lots immediately after the auction.

If you want to collect your lots from us after the day of the auction, you are to arrange a time/day beforehand. We can guarantee to provide payment and collection of material after the day of the auction only on Saturdays between 10 am and 3 pm.

UNPAID INVOICES

Invoices are to be paid within 14 days of the auction. If they are not paid within that time:

- you may forfeit your purchase/s;
- we may sell the lots or place them into a later auction;
- we may seek reimbursement from you of any resultant deficit in price; and/or
- we may charge you interest (to recover any costs we incur) at the rate of 10% per annum.

RETURN OF LOTS AND THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE BUYER

If you:

- inspected a lot prior to acquiring it at the auction; or
- buy a bulk lot, a large collection or an accumulation, or a lot containing more than 20 items (an 'item' includes an individual stamp or a set of stamps);

you are deemed to acknowledge that you have bought the lot with all faults and errors, and you cannot under any circumstances return your lot or part of any lot.

If you immerse in water or similarly treat lots you have purchased, unless we agree beforehand, you cannot under any circumstances return your lot or part of any lot.

If a lot was not available for inspection by you prior to sale, you may return the lot if there are errors in its description, or if faults have not been described by us, up to seven days from your receipt of the material.

Requests to return items and to receive a refund of the price paid are to be in writing, setting out the grounds for the requested return.

EXTENSION OF TIME TO OBTAIN EXPERT AUTHENTICATION

If you want to obtain the opinion of an expert in relation to the authenticity of any lot or part of any lot, before paying for it, you are to request us in writing prior to commencement of the auction, or advise the auctioneer at the time you successfully bid for the lot.

It is your responsibility to arrange for assessment by an expert as soon as possible. The lot is to remain with PHILAS, except by arrangement. We will provide it to the expert engaged by you.

It is expected that the outcome of any assessment be known within six weeks of the time of sale. Your request for an extension of time to pay for the lot might not be approved if the time required likely will exceed six weeks. Any approval for an extension of time for payment that has been given may be withdrawn if you are unable to obtain an assessment within six weeks of the date of the sale. We remind you that PHILAS is unable to pay the vendor pending the outcome of any assessment.

All costs incurred for expert assessment are your responsibility, except that if expert opinion suggests that an item is not genuine, PHILAS will reimburse you one-half of any fee you paid for the assessment.

APPLICABLE LAW

These Conditions of Sale are governed by and are to be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New South Wales. In the event of any dispute, you may commence an action only in a court in New South Wales.

The post office issued this stamp from 1888 as part of the Centennial series, on paper watermarked Crown/NSW and perforated variously 11 x 12, 12 x 11½ and 12. Apart from the absence of a watermark and the deviation in perforation, there are design differences, most notably the absence of a leaf below the word 'NEW' and the gradual increase in height from the left of the letters of 'POSTAGE'. Takuma was a stamp dealer in Sydney, but also an expert cameo engraver who produced fine designs on emu egg shells. The forgery was produced early in 1895 and is recorded used at post offices in the inner Sydney area for only about eight weeks. It seems to have been printed from a plate comprising four clichés, because it is recorded in four slightly different states. Apparently, Takuma used the stamps on his own mail, but did not try to capitalise further, and it seems his motive was simply to prove to himself that he was able to forge the stamp. The forgery was not identified to the postal authorities until 1897. Takuma was not charged with any offence. The stamp was demonetised, but after a public outcry, the decision was reversed. The concession authorised the company to exploit the resources and existing manpower (partly through a system of forced labour) and also to grant subconcessions and levy taxes, and granted a 25-year tax exemption. In return the Portuguese state received 7.5% of the company's profits and 10% of the sold shares. The company was required to settle 1,000 Portuguese families and provide education and public administration. Its headquarters was in Beira, from where it controlled the public administration and post offices. The company made only partial use of the prerogatives bestowed on it, but this was balanced by the fact it met very few of its obligations. Having only limited capital, it did little to develop the area, deriving most of its revenue from taxation and conscripted labour on its plantations. Resistance to the forced labour regime was a major cause of rebellions in 1902 and 1917. Despite the company's obligation under its charter to provide forces to maintain law and order, it was unable to meet these crises, and the Portuguese government mounted expensive interventions. Because of its poor performance and a shift, under the Salazar regime, towards Portuguese control and away from international control of the economy, the company's concession was not renewed when it expired in 1942. During mass civil disobedience demonstrations February-April 1961, on 14 April the Ilankai Thamil Arasu Kadchi (Federal Party) of the LTTE released a set of postage stamps for use within territory controlled by them. The protests blockaded government offices and brought civil administration to a standstill. Before digital communication, the postage stamp was a crucial medium for the expression of national identity. The stamps were perceived as emblems of defiance and the assertion of a national identity and a representation of aspirations for a parallel postal service.

In 1852 the company was awarded a British government contract to carry mail in western South America; a weekly Liverpool-Callao route was established in 1868 and London-Sydney in 1877 (the latter became the Orient Line). By 1873 it had the world's largest merchant steamship fleet, comprising 57 vessels, and almost entirely controlled the postal operations between or from Chile, Peru, and Ecuador via Panama to the U.S.A. and Europe. The stamps were issued to prepay the cost of carriage of mail between the company's ports of call.
